

In front of you, you should have a large laminated sorting grid and 40 pictures. The pictures are numbered from 1 to 40. They are numbered randomly in order to identify each picture.

Please now complete the sorting tasks A and B. Follow the instructions below, but feel free to ask the organizers for help at any time. We cannot tell you what any of the pictures are. There are no right or wrong answers – we are interested in what *your thoughts* and *your opinions* are about each of the pictures.

A. 'This picture makes me feel climate change is important'

1. First, sort the pictures into three piles, depending on how the picture makes you feel about climate change. Do this quickly, based on your first reaction to the picture. It doesn't matter how many pictures are in each pile.

2. OK, now take the pile you have marked as '**important**'. Which two pictures do you think, out of all of the pictures, make you feel **most strongly** that climate change is important? Stick these two pictures in the sorting grid boxes below the '4'.
 3. Now look again at the pictures you have in this pile. Which are the next three pictures that make you feel strongly that climate change is important? Stick these in the boxes below the '3' – it doesn't matter what order they are in, top-to-bottom.
 4. Take another look at the pictures. Which are the next five best pictures making climate change seem important? Stick these pictures to the boxes below the '2'.
 5. Take a last look at the pictures. Choose six pictures out of the ones that are left that make climate change seem important. Stick these pictures to the boxes below the '1'.
 6. Stick any pictures you still have from the 'important' pile and stick them to the boxes below the '0'.

7. Now take the pictures from the pile that made you feel climate change is '**not important**'. Which two pictures, out of all of the pictures in the pile, make you feel **most strongly** that climate change is not important? Stick these picture in the boxes below the '- 4'.
 8. Pick up the 'not important' pile again. Which next three pictures make you feel strongly that climate is not important? Stick these pictures in the boxes below the '- 3'.
 9. Carry on sorting the 'not important' pictures, working inwards, towards the boxes marked '0'.
 10. Last, pick up the pile you have marked as 'undecided'. Stick these pictures into the boxes you have left over.
 11. Please mark down on the sorting grid (next page) where you have ranked each picture (using the number written on each picture).
 12. Now call an organiser over to take a photo of your sorting grid. They will ask you some questions about how you have completed your sort and they will audio record the conversation.

B. 'This picture makes me feel that I can do something about climate change'

Un-stick all the pictures from the grid and put them in one pile again.

This sorting task is the same as last time, but this time, we would like you to think about how much the picture makes you feel in terms of how much you are able to do something about climate change.

1. First, sort the pictures again into three piles, but based on these new statements:

2. Pick up the **'I can do something'** about climate change pile. Like last time, choose the two pictures that make you feel **most strongly** and stick it in the '4' boxes.
3. As before, sort the rest of the pile, working from '3' to '2' to '1'. Place any leftover pictures in the '0' boxes.

4. Take the **'nothing I do will make any difference'** pile. Select the two pictures that make you feel **most strongly**, and stick them in the '- 4' boxes.
5. As before, sort the rest of the pile, working from '3' to '2' to '1'. Place any leftover pictures in the '0' boxes.

6. Last, pick up the pile you have marked 'undecided'. Stick these pictures into the boxes you have left over.
7. Mark down on the sorting grid (next page) where you have ranked each picture (using the number written on each picture).
8. Now call an organiser over to take a photo of your sorting grid. They will ask you some questions about how you have completed this second sort and they will audio record the conversation.
